WALKING ON SNOW AND ICE

Melting snow can freeze overnight, forming a thin layer of ice that is hard to see. The ground can then become very slippery in the morning when the ice starts to melt. In months where the ground is frozen, ground frost and ice can make it slippery for walking. No matter how well the snow is removed from parking lots or sidewalks, there will still be slippery places. What you wear on your feet can help lower your risk of falling. Boots or shoes that fit well and have a good grip are the best choice. Find a path to walk around the snow and ice when you can. Learn how to "Walk Like a Penguin." Walk slowly, take small steps and point your toes out slightly to be more stable on icy paths. Keep your head up and don't lean forward. Keep your hands out of your pockets to help keep your balance.

It's still cold outside, but spring & summer projects are on the minds of many homeowners. February is a good month to start planning for any exterior maintenance or changes to your property. Maybe your unit needs paint, new windows, fencing fixed, or just some general maintenance.
