(Date of report to WG Board was September 17, 2024) The end of September and October will be a busy one for your Wellington Greens maintenance staff. The following projects are on the list as well as taking care of work requests that the storm delayed:

- Grading and seeding bare areas and slopes.
- More tree removal and trimming.
- Stump grinding, backfill and seeding.

- Landmark Landscape will be planting 11 trees and 6 shrubs.

- The crew will be remodeling and leveling five tee boxes (1,4,5,6,7). The rest will be done next year.

SEWER CLEANOUTS

One court, "Wellington" recently had a sewer back-up in the building that includes unites three through eight. That building has a sewer line underneath the building and all units had to have their units camered, cleaned out and flushed. One unit had serious backup in the basement that had to be cleaned. One unit had a blockage and it was expensive to have it cleaned. One unit had to have the basement floor concret broken up and the plumbers dug down to the sewer line and dug a trench along that line until they found the break. The owners of units three through eight all went together and agreed to put all the sewer bills together and split them up equally by each unit because each unit uses the same line underneath the building. Many buildings in Wellington Greens have sewer lines that run underneath their building and many others have units where the sewer line goes directly to the City main. Our Association cleans out their lines in the common area on a rotating basis where they are cleaned out approximately every four years. Our grounds Superintendent, Nick Horvath, recommends that each owner have their sewers cleaned out peridodically to prevent a serious problem in the future. If you have any questions about your sewer line, or want a plumer recommendation, please ask Nick.
